What it's about:

This Workplace Health & Safety Queensland (WHSQ)-approved training course (WHSQ-HSR- NCB01) provides students with the skills and experience required to fill the role of Health & Safety Representative (HSR) as required by Queensland's Work Health & Safety (WHS) Act 2011. The course is designed for workers who have been elected as the HSR or deputy HSR for their workplace and are thus eligible to attend this training at the expense of their employer under Section 21 of the WHS Regulations. This course is also suitable for supervisors and managers who have responsibility for the safety of workers.

People it's best for:

From the 1st July 2018, all HSR's must undertake the relevant approved training course within six months of their election. Existing HSR's will have six months from the 1st July 2018 to undertake the training. If a worker refuses to undertake the training within the time period, they will no longer be eligible to fulfil the role of HSR and will need to be replaced.

Workers elected HRSs in QLD are encouraged to complete this Workplace Health & Safety Queensland (WHSQ) approved HSR Training within the first twelve months of being elected and are also entitled to attend refresher courses at twelve-month intervals. **Ballistic Training Solutions** also offers refresher programs.

HSRs must complete this course to allow them to perform additional HSR powers & functions as outlined in the *Work Health and Safety Act 2011*.

Certification:

Students will receive a certificate of attendance on completion.

Learning Outcomes:

Students will gain an understanding of their roles, powers, and functions in the representation, monitoring, investigation, and enquiry into WHS management at their workplace under the WHS Act. Additionally, students will learn about:

- The WHS legislative framework and key terminology relating to HSR powers, such as issuing provisional improvement notices (PINs) and directing the cessation of unsafe work
- The role of HSRs, Health & Safety Committees (HSCs), entry permit holders, and other WHS stakeholders
- Enforcement measures available for breaches of WHS legislation
- Requirements for consultation, representation, and participation on WHS issues in the workplace

Delivery Method:

Mode of delivery is face to face with group interaction and engagement as a core part of the learning process.
